The Footprint, a National Trust straw baled Eco building, found in the beautiful woods of St.Catherines in Windermere, will be running some wonderful events this year. They are offering lots of activities based on Deepening Connections with Nature and would love the local community to come and get involved.

They have lots of Green Wood and Whittling courses going on all year and a Permaculture Course starting in March. They also have Bushcraft activities for young and old and a monthly Bushcraft club for children. You may also like to join them on one of their Footprint Fridays, a 2 hour session, doing activities from Campfire Treats to Self Sufficient Gardening. If you fancy something wild, then their Canopy Camps and Midweek Refreshers may be the thing for you. Participants can go and sleep in hammocks in the canopy of the trees (high and low level camps available), waking up to birdsong and a campfire breakfast! But if you would prefer to be inside, sitting by the fire doing some craft, then look out for their Community Craft Share, which happens once a month.

Langstone New Role?

Langstone House in Broad Street has provided the base for local democratic process for the Windermere area since the days of Windermere Urban District Council and, amongst other



facilities, houses the Council Chamber still regularly utilised by Windermere Town Council.

However, the building has been deemed 'surplus to requirements' by South Lakeland District Council and is most likely to be considered for conversion into affordable homes. Provision has to remain in any proposed alterations for retention of the Council Chamber for use by the Town Council.

Should other suggestions come forward as to how the building could be converted to provide for the benefit of the wider community consideration would need to be given to them but, at this time, affordable housing presently appears the only consideration.

Big changes at RWYC

The clubhouse of the Royal Windermere Yacht Club, built in 1965, is currently undergoing major refurbishment along with the installation of a new lift, to give the building a 'facelift' and provide better facilities to members. Family membership has increased significantly over the past year and six new dinghies have been bought for use exclusively by youngsters. Adult and Junior Training for sailing and racing continue to play an important role in the Club's activities.

The Club is being given a generous donation by a local charity to promote sailing amongst youngsters, building

upon our success with the RWYC Youth Squad and the Summer Junior Training Programme. They plan to work with local schools, providing training in dinghy sailing and water safety, supporting youngsters who'd otherwise lack the opportunity to get out on the water. They also hope to find and develop future world champions!

Messiah at the Lakes

Staveley Choral will be performing Handel's The Messiah on the 5th April at The Lakes School. This will be a very different performance as it will be a theatrical/operatic production with lavish sets and costumes bringing to life the drama and passion of the story of The Messiah. Handel was a composer who never missed an opportunity to convey the drama of a story. In his music for The Messiah, using Charles Jennens libretto, who was a passionate evangelist living in the 18th century, Handel didn't disappoint in conveying the drama of Christ's life, death and resurrection.

Following their successful production of Carmina Burana they will work with the drama department at Kendal College under the direction of Hilary Pezet, Head of Theatre. Philip Burton, conductor of Staveley Choral, says "This will be quite an event. The last time anyone performed a theatrical interpretation of The Messiah was the English National Opera 2009. The sets will be designed by students from the college who will also provide stage management and lighting. We have four excellent opera singers as soloists and there will be opportunities for non-singing performers in the crowd scenes – in addition to Staveley Choral, of course!"



Fruity Windermere

A small group of local residents have been hard at work for the past three winters on a 'Fruity Windermere' project with the aim to increase the amount of locally grown food. They have planted fruit trees and bushes in places where anyone can help themselves. So if you notice apple or plum trees or fruit bushes in places where you hadn't spotted them before, they are there for you!

For the next planting season (2014/15) they intend to have a year off planting and will concentrate on maintenance by pruning and replacing damaged or lost trees. They also plan to have an apple pressing event in the autumn of this year so if you have an abundance of apples they can be turned into apple juice.

They have had some generous support from The Taverners, the Coop, Lakeland Landscapes, SLDC and United Utilities. They are also really appreciative of the help given to them by Continental Landscapes who have very kindly dug a lot of holes, a thank you to Will Hicks for providing mulch and to John Brockbank for making and erecting the wonderful guards around the trees in Birthwaite gardens and Queen's Park.

Oldfield Road: whitecurrant, gooseberry and blackcurrant

Translation Erro

Work commenced by the Bowness & Windermere Community Care Trust to tidy up the grounds around the public toilets at Bowness Bay has recently been completed. Clearance of the overgrown area to the rear of the toilets has created more accessible public space which has recently been complemented by the installation of traditional style railings alongside the steps leading down towards the toilets.

The project was funded by a grant obtained by BWCCT from the National Lottery and it is hoped that future planting and additional seating in the area will further enhance this previously very untidy corner close to The Glebe.

BWCCT operates all 8 of the public conveniences in Windermere and Bowness on a not for profit basis but is hoping that it will be able to attract investment that will enable the outdated facilities at Quarry Rigg to be refurbished.
