Windermere RePlay

ITV's People's Millions at Millerground – please help win £50,000 for the community.

The Millerground Enhancement Group was set up by the Windermere and Bowness Civic Society almost a year ago. It has been hard at work restoring the pathways, embankments and woods at Millerground, on the lakeshore off Rayrigg Road.

This is one of the few remaining areas on the east side of the lake, within walking distance of the town, that is still free and open for everyone to use. Community volunteers and students from local schools have been regularly turning up to help in all weathers. So far, with the aid of National Trust rangers they have managed to restore several pathways, clear undergrowth, plant bluebells and replace fences and gates.

Some small grants have been received from local businesses and individuals. These have helped to purchase basic materials, gravel and bulbs. The group put in a grant application to the "The People's Millions" Lottery fund under the name **Windermere RePlay**. The fantastic news is that this project has now been shortlisted and could win £50,000!

If successful the money would be used for a new outdoor exercise and adventure play area. This would be installed in the field above Millerground near the car park to provide a wonderful facility for children of all ages and abilities, as well as their parents and grandparents to enjoy a fantastic day out at Millerground.

But they need your help....

They will be competing against a large Carlisle based charity for this money. A short film about each application will be shown on ITV Border News on the 25th November. There will be a phone number for each charity advertised on the day to enable you to vote for **Windermere RePlay**. They ask everyone to pick up the phone on the **25th November** and vote to help the community.

Stopping and going

Concern from Windermere Town Council over the proposed termination of the 597 Bus service serving parts of Windermere and Bowness following the withdrawal of operating subsidies by Cumbria



County Council has coincided with the installation of a new bus shelter opposite the Ladyholme Centre at Goodly Dale.

The shelter has been provided by the Town Council and now provides welcome cover for those using this well utilised stop serving various routes. Discussions are ongoing between Town Council and County to identify opportunities that would see the 597 route retained.

Cumbria County Council have promised Windermere Town Council that they will soon be undertaking repairs to the road and pavements within the area of the Windermere Enhancement Scheme.

Concern had been expressed at the worsening, and potentially dangerous, condition of parts of Crescent Road and the very poor standard of repairs that had taken place to pavement areas following various works relating to utility services.

Nick Raymond of Cumbria County Council Highways assured the Town Council that repairs would be undertaken to the same specification and standard as required by the original scheme.

The clock tower marks the division between Windermere and Bowness-on-Windermere, and was built as a memorial to Mountford John Byrde Baddeley (1843-1906) who

wrote a series of well regarded walker's guides from the new town of Windermere.


